We are still studying the life of David using a video study by David Nasser, "King David, Trials, Temptations, and Triumphs." The series is filmed in Israel and shows the approximate spot of David's victory. The link is found in Rightnow Media, which everyone has access to.² In our last club meeting the author discussed how to handle life when life isn't fair. He used Psalm 57 as his text ("when he had fled from Saul into the cave") and puts us directly in the story we've been studying.
